## Research on the development of Ethiopia's PHC system

Ethiopia has achieved progress in improving the health outcomes of its citizens during the past decade, which is mainly attributed to the Health Extension program (HEP). The Program is a community-based PHC system, in which health extension workers provide door to door services. In the past four months, IIfPHC-E

made an extensive research to document the historical background of the HEP, from its initial inception to impact, including literature review and the current and anticipated future development. The documentation is currently finalized & will be used in training courses and for the resource center.

Further, it is anticipated that the research will help to inform Ethiopia's HEP in a changing land-scape. It will also facilitate the sharing of best experiences to countries in similar low income settings that wish to learn first hand. The final version of the document will be deposited in the IIFPHC-E Repository soon.

## Ethiopia's PHC resolution approved at World Health Assembly

The 72nd session of the World Health Assembly held in May 2019 has recognized the contribution made by community health workers to achieve universal health coverage. The Assembly approved Ethiopia's proposed resolution entitled 'Community

Health Workers delivering Primary Health Care.'
WHO affirmed that
community health workers
have a key role to play
in delivering PHC since
they speak local
languages & have the
trust of local people.
WHO has urged
countries and partners to

use its' guideline on health policy and system support to optimize community health worker programs and to allocate adequate resources following the adoption of the resolution. See WHA website for more information.

## The Health Extension Program Evaluation

IIfPHC-E proposed and engaged in the design of a project to evaluate the HEP through a private consultancy firm. Currently, the research is well underway by a team of experts. A cross-sectional data collection has been

made from different regions. Over 7,000 households were interviewed to collect primary data. Also, extensive documents have been reviewed. The next step will be conducting analysis and synthesis of the

huge amount of data gathered by the experts. The assessment will serve as an impetus for further strengthening the health extension program and PHC in Ethiopia
